VACCINATIONS/COGGINS: Present record of flu/rhino vaccination (within the past 6 months) & negative coggins documentation prior to schooling or riding. Email to swmrabs@gmail.com (add rider/horse names to subject line).

SCHOOLING: May 18th & 19th

- Ground Poles & Crossrails Saturday 7:30-8:00 AM; Breaks for 18"-2', 2'3", and 2'6"+
- Sunday for all 8-8:30 AM. 18" & .60 m 8:30-9. Breaks before .70m and .85-95m
- No more than 10 horses in the arena at one time. We ask that you respect the announcer when they announce that schooling is closing.
- Showing Exhibition ("not to be judged") will be permitted for \$10 per class. Non-showing horses are permitted, \$20 for the day.

SHOWING EXPECTATIONS:

- Rider classifications are used as follows: Children are riders 17 years old and younger on December first of the previous year. Adult Amateurs are riders 18 years old and over on December first of the previous year and who do not engage in activities that would classify him/her as a professional per the current USEF Rule Book. Professionals are riders who engage in activities described in the current USEF Rule Book and may compete in open classes. Rider classification status must be provided on SMHJA membership form.
- Dress Code: Riders should wear polo type shirt or shirt with collar (small left chest insignia allowed, but no t-shirts), conservative sweaters may also be allowed, breeches or jodhpurs, gloves (optional), and English style riding boots. Conservative colored ASTM approved headgear is mandatory when mounted. Formal hunt attire may be worn without penalty. Spurs of the unrowelled type, crops, and bats are optional. If themed jumper classes are offered, riders are considered entries as long as they are wearing an ASTM approved headgear, shirt, breeches or jodhpurs and English style riding boots along with wearing themed-related attire and/or outfit. Anyone not conforming to the dress code will not be considered an entry in the class.
- Horses and riders must maintain safe, discipline-appropriate tack and equipment at all times during SMHJA-approved events. Horses and riders may be excused from both competition and schooling during SMHJA-approved horse shows for use of unsafe or inappropriate tack or equipment, per the show manager's discretion.
- Tack and equipment includes, but is not limited to: discipline-appropriate saddles; legal bits (per USEF guidelines by discipline); appropriately adjusted and maintained tack.
- Horses must display appropriate condition and working soundness to compete in SMHJA-approved shows. Horses and riders may be excused from competition and schooling based on their body condition and visible soundness at SMHJA-approved shows, per the show manager's discretion.
- Open Card: To move the show along, the over fences classes (Hunter I & Hunter II) in each division will be run on an "open card." Children and Adult sections may also be run simultaneously as well.
- SCRATCHES: Refunds will be given if notice of scratch is given prior to day 1 of the show, (May 17th) or sooner. Scratches that are given May 18th-19th will not be refunded unless a veterinarian's note is presented.

Spectators: Join us! Bring lawn chairs. Leave dogs at home. If setting up a tent/canopy, check with show management.

Concessions/Food Truck will be announced! CASH only please.

Severe Weather Policy: In the event of severe weather, when a severe weather warning has been issued, or at the sighting of lighting, the hearing of thunder, or the sighting of other severe weather (such as a funnel cloud, blizzard, etc.), the competition be stopped until at least 30 minutes have passed without severe weather. Should competition be stopped for lightning, all participants should take shelter in a large enclosed structure if possible or in fully enclosed vehicles and stay away from metal or conducting surfaces. Resuming competition will be at the discretion of the show manager, provided at least 30 minutes have passed without severe weather divisions which have been completed on the show date or the corresponding rain date.

Gambler's Choice

105. .70m / 106. .80m / 107. .85-95m

Held after each above height division. Jump as many jumps as you can in 55 seconds, racking up points for each jump cleared. If a rail comes down, fence points don't count and cannot be jumped again. Time starts when you jump your first fence. Whistle will sound at the end of the 55 sec; end your round by passing the FINISH marker as fast as you can. Ties broken by the number of seconds accumulated after 55 to the finish line. Jump the designated "Gambler's Fence" for bonus points; can be jumped 2 times. Class not for points, but prizes awarded to top 2 finishers at each height.
